# from Pastor Megan

As we began the season of Lent this year, I was struck by my typical decision of what to "give up" for Lent. My usual go to has been Mountain Dew- although having switched to Mountain Dew Zero sugar last year that didn't seem as impactful. I had thought about various unhealthy foods, television habits or social media as I have found that the discipline of Lent has traditionally helped me recognize that our relationship with God impacts all areas of our lives so fasting from things that get in the way of my wholistic health allows me to refocus on my connection to God. And yet, nothing really jumped out at me as the "thing" to give up... everything I thought of I either rarely did it or I thought of a reason that it wouldn't make sense (it's hard to give up social media when you use it for online devotions and church). I have recently also promoted the idea that although Lent is a time of self denial/fasting, it is also a time that we are called to reconnect with God by adding spiritual disciplines or acts of mercy to our lives. The daily devotions and challenges that I put together for our "Lent in a bag" would certainly be ways to "add" something for Lent, but I still usually try to give something up as well.

Then I read a blog post titled "Lent for Pastors who have given up everything already". In the post it listed a variety of things pastors have "given up" this year... hospital/nursing home visits, in person worship, potlucks, hugs and handshakes, the common cup in communion, etc. And this doesn't just apply to pastors, we all have given up much this year. Eating out, trips, normal work life, visits with family... and even if we didn't give them up completely, the ease and familiarity with which we used to be able to do life was suddenly changed. The blogger then asked the question, "So what does this Lent look like for pastors who have given up so much?"

I thought I'd rephrase her question and answer for a broader audience... What does Lent look like for people who have given up so much?

Maybe it looks like embracing the gift of recognizing that we are not in control. Maybe it looks like the early church, where awe came upon everyone because so many incredible things were being done in the name of God. Maybe we see and believe in the things we as the Body of Christ share in common and help each other as we have need. Maybe we spend much time in prayer, having glad and generous hearts, and praising God. Maybe this Lent we are called to be a part of a new awakening to the presence of God.

My prayer for all of us this season and always is that we remember again & again that no matter where we are or what we've done, God meets us where we are and opens the door for us to be formed, changed, molded and transformed into beloved children we are called to be. May you find ways to embrace your belovedness in God, rest in the grace of Christ and be inspired to embrace the new life God is calling us to.

#### IN PERSON UPDATE....

With the decrease in COVID cases in our area and the increase in people who have been vaccinated it feels like the right time to safely bring more people back into the church building. We will re-evaluate regularly and keep you informed as to when we may add additional services or alter our procedures.
